

400 meters with timing of 50.79 Seconds that she clocked at the 2018 Asian Games in Jakarta, Indonesia. She is the first Indian athlete to win a gold medal in a track event at the IAAF World U20 Championships. She was appointed as a Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP) in Assam Police under the state's Integrated Sport Policy.

She was conferred with Arjuna Award by the President of India on 25th September 2018.

several companies. Pramila Nesargi is known as a maverick lawyer with many distinctions to her credit. She obtained a law degree at an early age and started practicing law. She has been a member of the dictionary committee for English – Kannada translation. She is the first woman to be elected in the past 50 years to the Karnataka Bar Council as Chairman of Bar Association.

Anshu Jamsenpa, born on 31st December 1979 is an Indian mountaineer and the first woman in the world to scale the summit of Mount Everest

twice in a season, and the fastest double summitter to do so within 5 days. It is also the fastest double ascents of the tallest crest by a woman. She is from Bomdila, headquarters of West Kameng District, Arunachal Pradesh – the state that holds most northeastern position of India. She was awarded India's fourth highest civilian award the Padma Shri in 2021. She was conferred with the Tenzing Norgay National Adventure Award in 2017 by the President Shri Ram Nath Kovind.

Manasi Pradhan born on 4th October 1962 in Odisha is an Indian Women's Rights Activist and Author. She is the founder of Honour for Women National Campaign, a nationwide movement to end violence against women in India. In 2014, she was conferred with Rani

Laskhmibai Stree Shakti Puraskar by the President of India. Along with Mary Prema Pierick, global head of the Missionaries of Charity, she won the 'Outstanding Women Award' in 2011. In 2016, the New York based *Bustle* named her among 20 most inspiring Feminists Authors and Activists. In 2017, the Los Angeles based Welker Media Inc. named her among 12 most powerful feminist change makers.

She fought successfully the widely prevalent social taboo against educating women, walked 15 km daily amidst hilly terrain and swamp to the only high school in the entire region to emerge as first woman matriculate of her village and subsequently the first woman law graduate of her region.

named among the strongest women personalities in the country by Forbes. Kullu, working in Villages of Sundargarh District for the last 15 years as an ASHA worker, has been instrumental in bringing the healthcare system closer to the people of the rural village. Listing her third in the Forbes India W-Power 2021 list, Forbes noted that the ASHA worker has devoted her life to looking after 964 people in the Baragaon Tehsil. She is the village's COVID-19 warrior. Kullu has made an immeasurable amount of work in the health sector despite earning only Rs 4,500 a month.

representing India at International Competitions. She won Bronze Medal in 2018 World Cup Gymnastics in Women's Vault event in Melbourne. She created history by becoming the first Indian to clinch a medal at Gymnastics World Cup. She has also won Two Gold Medals in the Table Vault and Floor Events in the EGYPTIAN PHARAOHS CUP 2021, held in Cairo, Egypt from 17th – 19th December, 2021.

She is coached personally by Neha Chavan from Gagan Narang Sports Promotion Foundation. She recieved the Arjuna Award 2022 for shooting at the hands of President Droupadi Murmu.

Flight Lieutenant Avani Chaturvedi, born on 27th October 1993, is an Indian Pilot from Rewa District, Madhya

Pradesh. She was declared as the first Woman Combat Pilot along with Mohana Singh Jitarwal and Bhawana Kanth. The trio was inducted into the Indian Air Force Fighter Squadron in June 2016. In 2018, Chaturvedi became the first Indian woman pilot to take a solo flight in a MiG-21 and was promoted to the rank of Flight Lieutenant. On 9th March 2020, Chaturvedi was awarded with Nari Shakti Puraskar by President Ram Nath Kovind.

She witnessed Kasab and another terrorist attack the hospital and murder the guards. Though extremely scared, she gathered courage, rushed to the first floor, closed the main iron door and shifted all the patients to the pantry with the help of another staff. She locked the door and switched off the lights so that the shooters could not see the patients. At all costs, her only aim was to protect the patients and she did it. We salute her!

Gita Gopinath Dy Managing Director, IMF

Gita Gopinath (born 8th December 1971) is an Indian - American economist, born in Kolkata in a Malayali family has served as the first Deputy Managing Director of the International

Monetary Fund (IMF), since 21st January 2022. She had previously served as chief economist of the IMF between 2019 and 2022.

Gita Gopinath was appointed as Chief Economist of the IMF in October 2018. In December 2021, she was appointed as the first Deputy Managing Director of the IMF, which is the organization's number-two position.

She was named one of the top 25 economists under 45 by the International Monetary Fund in 2014 and was chosen as a Young Global Leader by the World Economic Forum in 2011. In 2019, she was awarded the Pravasi Bharatiya Samman by the President of India.

COM. PRABHAT KAR
Born: 13-10-1910 - Died: 27-11-1984
General Secretary, AIBEA: 1953 to 1980
Member of Parliament: 1957 to 1967
President AIBEA: 1980 to 1984

Com. Prabhat Kar was the architect of AIBEA, with the characteristic courage of his convictions and vision, Com. Prabhat Kar, along with a group of young, angry but dedicated comrades took the historic decision on 9th April, 1941 to form an all India organisation for bank employees and on 20th April, 1946 this vision stood translated into reality with the formation of AIBEA afterwhich Com. Prabhat Kar started a ceaseless and unremitting struggle to unify all banks employees under a single banner with a slogan "One industry, one union".

Com. Prabhat Kar built AIBEA into a formidable organisation because of which the Bank Employees could come out of the phase of tribunalisation and third party intervention and sign the historic first industry level Bipartite Settlement in 1966. AIBEA is the only union to have signed all 11 Bipartite Settlements.

AIBEA, under the leadership of Com. Prabhat Kar, relentlessly campaigned for nationalization of major Banks which was achieved in July 1969.

We dedicate the 11th Bipartite Settlement to Com. Prabhat Kar.



COM. H L PARVANA Born: 3-11-1923 -Died: 18-4-1975

Along with the doyen Com. Prabhat Kar, Com. H L Parvana was the architect of AIBEA. Com. Parvana was the centre of activities of the Bank employees' movement in and around Delhi and was responsible in forming Trade Unions in different Banks during the 1950s. Com. Parvana was always known for his hard work. Whether it was the fight before the Sastri and Desai Tribunals in 1950s and 60s, whether it was the fight to achieve Bipartite Settlement in 1965-66 or the sustained struggle for nationalisation of Banks from 1960, Com. Parvana was straining every nerve to gear up the rank and file to back up the organisation's demands for their eventual accomplishment.

In Com. Prabhat Kar's words:


He was the life and soul of the AIBEA centre. His dedication to the cause and thoroughness of minutest details are unparalleled. In every dimension of work of AIBEA, he was indispensable. In movement, in agitation, in campaign, in negotiations, in settling differences and solving problems his unique contribution was visible.

As an agitator, organiser, as a leader conversant with every sphere of Trade Union movement, his imprint was distinct. He was a comrade with clarity, with vision and a comrade who never knew tiredness. It is almost impossible to think of Central Office of AIBEAminus Com. Parvana.

His amiable disposition brought everybody near him and he became the closest friend, philosopher and guide of each and every bank employee. He was a man of the masses.
